

To apply for the 2019 Pathways To Jazz recording grant, musicians will need to submit a Letter of Intent for consideration. Musicians who have never been funded directly or indirectly by Pathways To Jazz will be considered first. Historically, grants have ranged from \$1,000-\$5,000; however, funding amounts will not be determined until applications are reviewed.

Letters of intent are due by May 10, 2019. If approved, you will be notified by the end of May that you are able to apply for the grant. You will do so through the Boulder County Arts Alliance website <u>www.bouldercountyarts.org</u> between June 1-June 30, 2019. Applications will not be accepted after 5pm on June 30, 2019.

Determinations will be made in July, and the applicant will be notified within the first three weeks of August. If you are awarded a grant, you will have until Dec. 31, 2020 to complete your project. A final report will also be due by this date.

The Letter of Intent should include answers to the five questions below, and any other pertinent information that will help us to understand your project. The length of the letter should be one-two pages.

Please answer these questions:

- 1. What is the budget for your project? (Please provide details beyond just a single number.) Please provide some specifics about what you will use the grant money for.
- 2. Where will you be recording? If unknown, please list as such.
- 3. What type of music do you want to record? Please describe your project.
- 4. Who will play on your recording? If unknown, please list as such.
- 5. Please provide a <u>brief</u> description of your past experience.
